INSTRUCTIONS

TO OPEN:

Push down on the platform until the ladder is unfolded, continue to push on the platform until it is securely engaged.



TO CLOSE:

Grab the handle at the back of the platform and pull upwards, disengaging the platform. The ladder will then fold inward until it is in storage position.

PROPER SELECTION

- 1. Select ladder size to reach work without climbing above the highest standing level or over-
- 2. Weight of user, tools, and materials shall not exceed working load capacity.
- 3. Use a fiberglass or wood ladder if working with or around electricity.

TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- 1. Secure ladder when transporting to avoid excessive wear or loading at vehicle support points.
- 2. Store ladder where dry and protected from unsafe materials, impact, or corrosion damage.

- 1. Inspect before use. Do not use ladders with missing, loose, damaged, or non-operating parts.
- 2. Make sure locks are in good working order.
- 3. Replace heavily worn feet and illegible labels. Never make temporary repairs of damaged or missing parts. Remove damaged or worn ladders from service, and contact manufacturer for replacement parts.
- 4. Keep ladder clean and free of slippery substances.
- 5. Destroy ladder if exposed to fire or chemical corrosion.

PROPER SET-UP AND USE

- 1. Do not use ladder if your judgment or balance is reduced by age, health, alcohol, or drugs.
- 2. Designed for use by one person at a time. Do not exceed working load.
- 3. Lock spreaders.
- 4. Do not straddle over ladder top. Do not sit on any part of ladder.
- 5. Face ladder and use both hands when climbing up or down. Remove jewelry, and wear clean slip -resistant work shoes. Use extreme caution getting on and off ladder.
- 6. Stand only on front steps of ladder.
- 7. Lean into or hold onto ladder to maintain three points of contact while working.
- 8. Do not over-reach. Keep ladder close to work and body centered between side rails. Climb down and move ladder as needed. Do not walk or move ladder while standing on it.
- 9. Use care if pushing or pulling to side.
- 10. Do not climb on or off ladder from side unless it is secured against tipping or sideward motion.

 11. Have another person hold ladder when possible.

 12. Do not use ladder in high winds or storms.

- 13. Do not spend long periods on a ladder without regular breaks.
- 14. Never drop or apply an impact load to ladder.
- 15. Do not use where electrical hazard exists.
